





HOLY COMMUNION AT CALVARY

“Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him” (Psalm 34:8).



God’s Word teaches the real presence of Christ’s body and blood invisibly in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins. We take seriously the spiritual care of those who commune at our altar. The Word of God states that no one offend against Christ and His Word by denying His true presence and its promise and seal of forgiveness. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (see 1 Cor. 11:27–29), and because Holy Communion is a confession of what is taught and believed at this altar (1 Cor. 11:26), any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession (beliefs) differing from that of this congregation (that is, belong to another church body or denomination) and yet desire to receive the Sacrament will have to first speak with the pastor before communing.

⁴By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. ⁵By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. ⁶And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. ⁷By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

⁸By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. ¹¹By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful

who had promised. ¹²Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.

¹³These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. ¹⁴For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. CALVARY LUTHERAN CHURCH FOOD PANTRY: Calvary has established a food pantry to serve our community, which has been running for three months now, serving anywhere from 12 to 23 people per month. This pantry is our opportunity to reach out to those in need in our own neighborhood and offer a helping hand. On the 1st Tuesday of each (8:30am - 10:30am, while supplies last), we hand out groceries, perishable/non-perishable, and personal items from the Old Harford Road lobby. Flyers with additional details and a shopping list can be found on the back tables, there is a bin for donations in the Old Harford Road lobby, and we're always happy to accept cash donations! Hopefully soon, the Pantry will be moving into the classroom next to the office hallway door to allow for more storage and work space. We're always looking for volunteers to help

pack food, keep inventory, shop, and distribute food on the 1st Tuesday (contact Pat Bell). Additionally, we're looking for volunteers to reach out to vendors and other retail outlets to establish partnerships for assistance in stocking the pantry. If you have any questions or would like to volunteer or lead any of these opportunities, please contact Sunnie Bell, Bridget Jones, Rosa White, or any member of the Board of Outreach. ***Pantry items needed for next month:*** cereal, shelf stable milk, canned goods, fruit & applesauce cups, and adult diapers. *Many of the neighbors we have been serving through the Food Pantry are in need of/want fresh produce and we have started offering that. If you or someone you know has a garden and more produce than they can use - please consider donating to the Calvary Food Pantry! Thank you!*

There is a small display of prayer shawls in the narthex. You are welcome to take one. If you take a prayer shawl, please sign the paper placed on the black cabinet by the elevator. (First name of person receiving the prayer shawl reason is optional). The Prayer Shawls are a gift for you from Calvary's congregation. The yarn is donated by members. Each shawl uses approximately 3, 6 ounce skeins of yarn. Also needed are some medium size gift bags; if you wish to contribute to this ministry.

Calvary's Career Planning and Learning Center is now quietly reaching out to folks in the community who want to move forward. It is a hub for adults to prepare for GED testing, improve job search and resume' writing skills, practice interviewing, receive mentoring and dress-for-success coaching. The volunteer Tutors and Mentors walk step by step with learners to clarify requirements and encourage in Christian love and caring. Won't you be part of this growing mission? -- be a tutor, refer a student, be a door keeper when the labs are in session, help with resume' writing, share your own job experiences that may instill new ideas and open doors to new jobs, financially support the program using the little Grace Place House envelopes in the pews.
