**HOLY COMMUNION AT CALVARY**

*“Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him” (Psalm 34:8).*



**God’s Word teaches the real presence of Christ’s body and blood invisibly in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins. We take seriously the spiritual care of those who commune at our altar. The Word of God states that no one offend against Christ and His Word by denying His true presence and its promise and seal of forgiveness. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (see 1 Cor. 11:27–29), and because Holy Communion is a confession of what is taught and believed at this altar (1 Cor. 11:26), any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession (beliefs) differing from that of this congregation (that is, belong to another church body or denomination) and yet desire to receive the Sacrament will have to first speak with the pastor before communing.**

## †THE CONFESSION OF SINS AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

P: Friends in Christ, throughout this past Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism. Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving the peace of reconciliation. Let us confess our sin and look to our Savior who forgives through His death and resurrection.

*Please kneel, if able*

P: Almighty and all merciful God,

**C: We confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways, to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.**

P: “Thus it is written, that the Messiah had to suffer, die, and rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins must be proclaimed in His name.” That word is now proclaimed to you. Jesus carried our sins to His own death. His sacrifice is complete and full. He has won the victory over death! He is your living, personal, and sure Redeemer. Hardened hearts are crushed. Stone walls of sin have been rolled away. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 15:1–11

*(Proof of the resurrection of Christ.)*

<sup>1</sup>Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received,  
in which you stand, <sup>2</sup>and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I  
preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

<sup>3</sup>For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our  
sins in accordance with the Scriptures, <sup>4</sup>that he was buried, that he was raised on the third  
day in accordance with the Scriptures, <sup>5</sup>and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the  
twelve. <sup>6</sup>Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom  
are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. <sup>7</sup>Then he appeared to James, then to all the  
apostles. <sup>8</sup>Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. <sup>9</sup>For I am the least  
of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.  
<sup>10</sup>But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On  
the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God  
that is with me. <sup>11</sup>Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Matthew 28:1-20

*(The resurrection account.)*

Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. <sup>4</sup> And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. <sup>5</sup> But the angel said to the women, “Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he<sup>[a]</sup> lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you.” <sup>8</sup> So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> And behold, Jesus met them and said, “Greetings!” And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, “Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me.”

<sup>11</sup> While they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place. <sup>12</sup> And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers <sup>13</sup> and said, “Tell people, ‘His disciples came by night and stole him away while we were asleep.’ <sup>14</sup> And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble.” <sup>15</sup> So they took the money and did as they were directed. And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day. <sup>16</sup> Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup> And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in<sup>[b]</sup> the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”
